He misses Ayanna during his grief, he knows having her with him would make a difference. He blames himself for her absence during such a tormenting phase in his young adult life. He still loves Ayanna and is not sure if he is ever going to see her again. Five weeks after the birth of the babies, Clever loses his job. He struggles financially for more than a year before he finds another job. Following years of aloofness, discomposure, and blatant disson, frustration begins to break down their marriage. Six years into the rocky marriage, Rosita secretly flies to Brazil for a cosmetic procedure. She dies in the process. The children shed tears when they see their mother in a coffin for the last time at the funeral service. Rosita is given a dignified funeral service. Clever becomes very sorrowful and starts blaming himself, pondering if there is something that he could have done to have prevented her from making the trip. The children are now six years old, a difficult phase to grow up without their mother. Clever loves his children, and he has difficulty trusting another woman. He becomes a successful businessman after graduate school and money is no longer a problem. Through all of his achievements, he remains single. He intensifies his effort to find Ayanna, and he unexpectedly meets her again at his undergraduate school's homecoming. He proposes to her, and she says yes. They have a dream wedding. She embraces and cares for Clever's two children as if they were her biological children. She loves Clever's mother as her own mother. Living with Ayanna is living in total peace and contentment; it is an experience like no other – one that words cannot sufficiently describe. It has always been Clever's desire to one day return to his native land. Ayanna, now a cardiologist, is receptive to the idea and even encourages him to do so.
